From Homeless to Homeowner

To put it mildly, Winford Blair has had a difficult year. An elderly man with a monthly income that barely exceeds \$750, he could hardly afford the basic necessities of life and his monthly utilities. Out of desperation, Mr. Blair allowed the homeowner's insurance policy on his older model single-wide manufactured home to expire last year. Shortly thereafter, the home was destroyed in a fire that claimed nearly everything that Mr. Blair owned. His pride would not allow him to seek help from his family and friends, so Mr. Blair made the difficult decision to live for the next year in his automobile. Finally, in March of 2007, Mr. Blair visited the offices of HOMES in Whitesburg, KY. Immediately recognizing the need to serve this gentleman, HOMES began the process of counseling and pre-qualifying Mr. Blair for a mortgage loan. FAHE received a pre-application on Mr. Blair in late July and submitted the loan to KHC for an MRB Trust Fund/Rural Development loan. When the house was completed on August 3rd, HOMES allowed Mr. Blair to begin occupying the property while the loan was continuing to be processed. The loan closed in mid-September. As a result of this partnership between HOMES, FAHE and KHC, Winford Blair has gone from homeless to homeowner!
